

Good Shepherd Fairview Home ACF Visitation Fact Sheet

- Visitors and residents must comply with Social distancing, hand hygiene, and wear face masks at all times. All masks must be discarded upon exiting the grounds.
- Visitors must be screened prior to the visit, including temperature checks.
- Due to the inclement weather of upstate NY, visitation will be allowed inside in a well-ventilated space with no more than 10 individuals in large areas, room visits are limited to 2 visitors at any one time. Social distancing and proper PPE must be maintained during the duration of the visit. Outdoor visits may commence once weather is appropriate for our residents and families to be outside.
- Should the positivity rate for the area exceed 10% visitation will continue but only outdoors weather permitting.
- Visits are by appointment only and are limited to 30 minutes.
- Visitors must be 18 years of age or accompanied by an adult 18 years of age or older.
- Documentation on visitors name, address, phone, and e-mail is required.
- Good Shepherd reserves the right to refuse any visitor who refuses to be compliant with any aspect of the visitation guidelines or is under the influence, disruptive or presents a danger to any resident or staff.

Visitation times are:

Mondays-10 a.m. -12 p.m. and 3p.m. to 6p.m.

Wednesdays- 10a.m. to 2p.m.

Fridays-10 a.m. to 12 p.m. and 3 p.m. to 6 p.m.

Saturdays- 10a.m. – 1p.m.

❖ **In the event of any staff and/or resident cases of Covid-19 at the facility, visitation will be suspended until further notice.**

Hand Hygiene: Whether you use soap and water or hand sanitizer, rub your hands together for at least **20 seconds**.

Use hand sanitizer if soap and water are unavailable

1. Apply the recommended amount of gel to the palm of one hand.
2. Cover all surfaces of the hands and fingers.
3. Rub the hands together for **approximately 20 seconds**.

Proper way to wear mask



Wear a mask that covers your nose and mouth to help protect others in case you're infected with COVID-19 but don't have symptoms

- Wear a mask in public settings when around people who don't live in your household, especially when it may be difficult for you to stay six feet apart
- Wear a mask correctly for maximum protection
- **Don't** put the mask around your neck or up on your forehead
- **Don't** put the mask below your nose or chin.
- **Don't** touch the mask, and, if you do, wash your hands or use hand sanitizer to disinfect
