

Good Shepherd Village at Endwell Visitation Fact Sheet-For Assisted Living Effective 9/16/20

- Visitors and residents must comply with social distancing, hand hygiene, and wear disposable face masks at all times.
- All masks must be discarded upon exiting the grounds.
- Visitors must be screened prior to the visit, including temperature checks.
- Good Shepherd will not permit any in room visitation unless resident is receiving end of life care.
- All visitation will take place outdoors, weather permitting. Only under certain limited circumstances will visitation be allowed inside in a well-ventilated space. (i.e. sudden inclement weather at the time of a scheduled visit, special resident specific circumstances to be determined by interdisciplinary team)
- Visits are by appointment only and are limited to 30 minutes
- The number of visitors will vary depending on the in-house census
- Visitors must be 18 years of age
- No pets allowed
- Documentation on visitors name, address, phone, and e-mail is required.
- Good Shepherd reserves the right to refuse any visitor who refuses to be compliant with any aspect of the visitation guidelines or is under the influence, disruptive or presents a danger to any resident or staff.
- Per NYS Department of Health guidelines directives, any visitor that fails to adhere to the protocol will be prohibited from visiting for the duration of the COVID-19 state declared public health emergency.

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Visits be scheduled by appointment only

Monday & Wednesday: 10am-12pm and 4pm-5:15pm

Thursday: 2-4pm

❖ *In the event of any staff and/or resident cases of Covid-19 at the facility, visitation will be suspended until further notice.*

Hand Hygiene: Whether you use soap and water or hand sanitizer, rub your hands together for at least **20 seconds**.

Use hand sanitizer if soap and water are unavailable

1. Apply the recommended amount of gel to the palm of one hand.
2. Cover all surfaces of the hands and fingers.
3. Rub the hands together for **approximately 20 seconds**.

Proper way to wear mask



Wear a mask that covers your nose and mouth to help protect others in case you're infected with COVID-19 but don't have symptoms

- Wear a mask in public settings when around people who don't live in your household, especially when it may be difficult for you to stay six feet apart
- Wear a mask correctly for maximum protection
- **Don't** put the mask around your neck or up on your forehead
- **Don't** put the mask below your nose or chin.
- **Don't** touch the mask, and, if you do, wash your hands or use hand sanitizer to disinfect
